This release is to confirm that our beef comes from a "closed herd". That is, the animals are born and raised at Blue Sky Farm. We own both the heifers and the bull and no outside animals (or possible contaminates) are introduced to the herd. In addition, our Scottish Highlanders are fed only high quality grain, hay and pasture grass. Absolutely no animal by-product feed is used. The only proteins used, come from soybean and cotton seed.

As you know, Scottish Highlander beef is unsurpassed for flavor and tenderness. Lean and low in cholesterol, it carries just the right amount of marbling through the meat to give that succulence and flavor so typical of old fashioned traditional beef. (the Highland is insulated by long hair rather than a thick layer of fat). It lends itself magnificently to a range of cooking methods and different recipes
